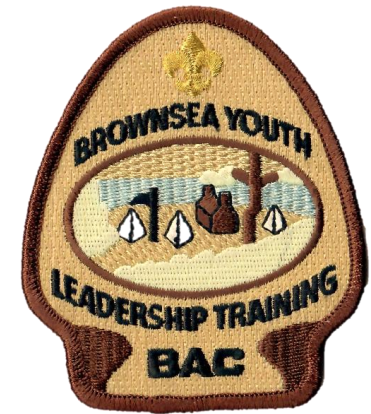

What Happens at Brownsea?

Scouts form patrols and learn to camp, cook, and work together for three days and nights. Participants take part in patrol activities that offer opportunities for hands-on learning, team work, and fun, and they attend presentations and ceremonies that develop character and citizenship.

Brownsea prepares Scouts to lead others by learning to lead themselves. It is designed to enhance and expand on the training in leadership and Scoutcraft provided by a Scout's troop and paves the way for more advanced leadership courses, including National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT).

The History of Brownsea

In 1907, Lord Baden-Powell trained the first Scouts at Brownsea Island in southwestern England and his success there inspired him to found the Scouting movement the following year.

Modeled on this experience, the Brownsea Youth Leadership Training course has trained hundreds of Scouts in Scout skills, teamwork, and leadership over the past 40+ years. Beginning in 2021, Brownsea became a council course open to all BAC Scouts.



Who Can Attend?

The Brownsea experience is open to all Scouts **who have attained the rank of Second Class and higher** and are in good standing in the Baltimore Area Council. Boys and girls in leadership positions and between the ages of 12 to 17 will benefit, as the course stresses outdoor skills and Scouting values.

Scouts who successfully complete Brownsea training are awarded a Brownsea certificate, patch, and neckerchief to reflect their achievement.

What does Brownsea Cost?

The fee to attend for Brownsea is **\$130.00** per Scout. If paid before July 15, this fee will be discounted to **\$115.00**. Full and partial scholarships are available to Scouts who demonstrate financial need.
